This support represents significant investment at institutions across Arkansas.

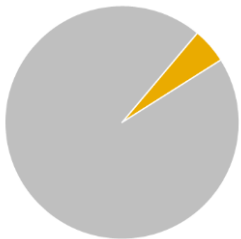

- National Science Foundation (\$641,000)
- HHS (including NIH) (\$103,000)
- Department of Agriculture (\$14,000)

Leading Recipients of Social and Behavioral Science Research Funding in **Arkansas**

- University of Arkansas, Fayetteville (\$689,000)
- Arkansas State University, Jonesboro (\$237,000)
- University of Central Arkansas (\$142,000)
- University of Arkansas at Little Rock (\$107,000)



The federal government spends approximately \$37.9 billion annually on research and development.

Of that total, **less than 5% (\$1.9 billion)** is invested in
Social and Behavioral Science Research.
