This support represents significant investment at institutions across Ohio.

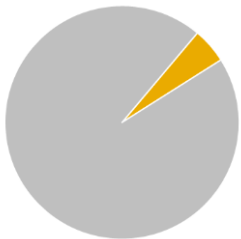

Leading Recipients of Social and Behavioral Science Research Funding in Ohio

- Ohio State University, The (\$22.9M)
- Case Western Reserve University (\$4.6M)
- University of Cincinnati (\$3.1M)
- Kent State University (\$2.3M)
- Miami University (\$1.8M)
- Ohio University (\$1.4M)



The federal government spends approximately \$37.9 billion annually on research and development.

Of that total, **less than 5% (\$1.9 billion)** is invested in
Social and Behavioral Science Research.
