This support represents significant investment at institutions across Oklahoma.

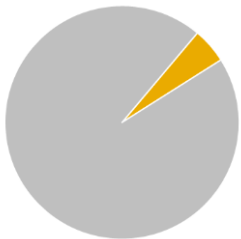

Primary Sources of Federal Social and Behavioral Science Research Funding to **Oklahoma**

- HHS (including NIH) (\$1.0M)
- National Science Foundation (\$906,000)
- Department of Defense (\$581,000)
- Department of Agriculture (\$276,000)

Leading Recipients of Social and Behavioral Science Research Funding in **Oklahoma**

- University of Oklahoma, Norman and Health Science Center (\$3.0M)
- Oklahoma State University, Stillwater (\$592,000)
- University of Tulsa (\$323,000)



The federal government spends approximately \$37.9 billion annually on research and development.

Of that total, **less than 5% (\$1.9 billion)** is invested in
Social and Behavioral Science Research.
