This support represents significant investment at institutions across Wisconsin.

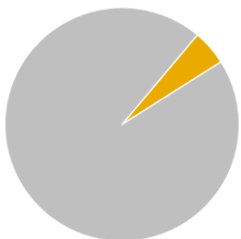

- University of Wisconsin-Superior (\$57,000)



The federal government spends approximately \$37.9 billion annually on research and development.

Of that total, **less than 5% (\$1.9 billion)** is invested in
Social and Behavioral Science Research.
